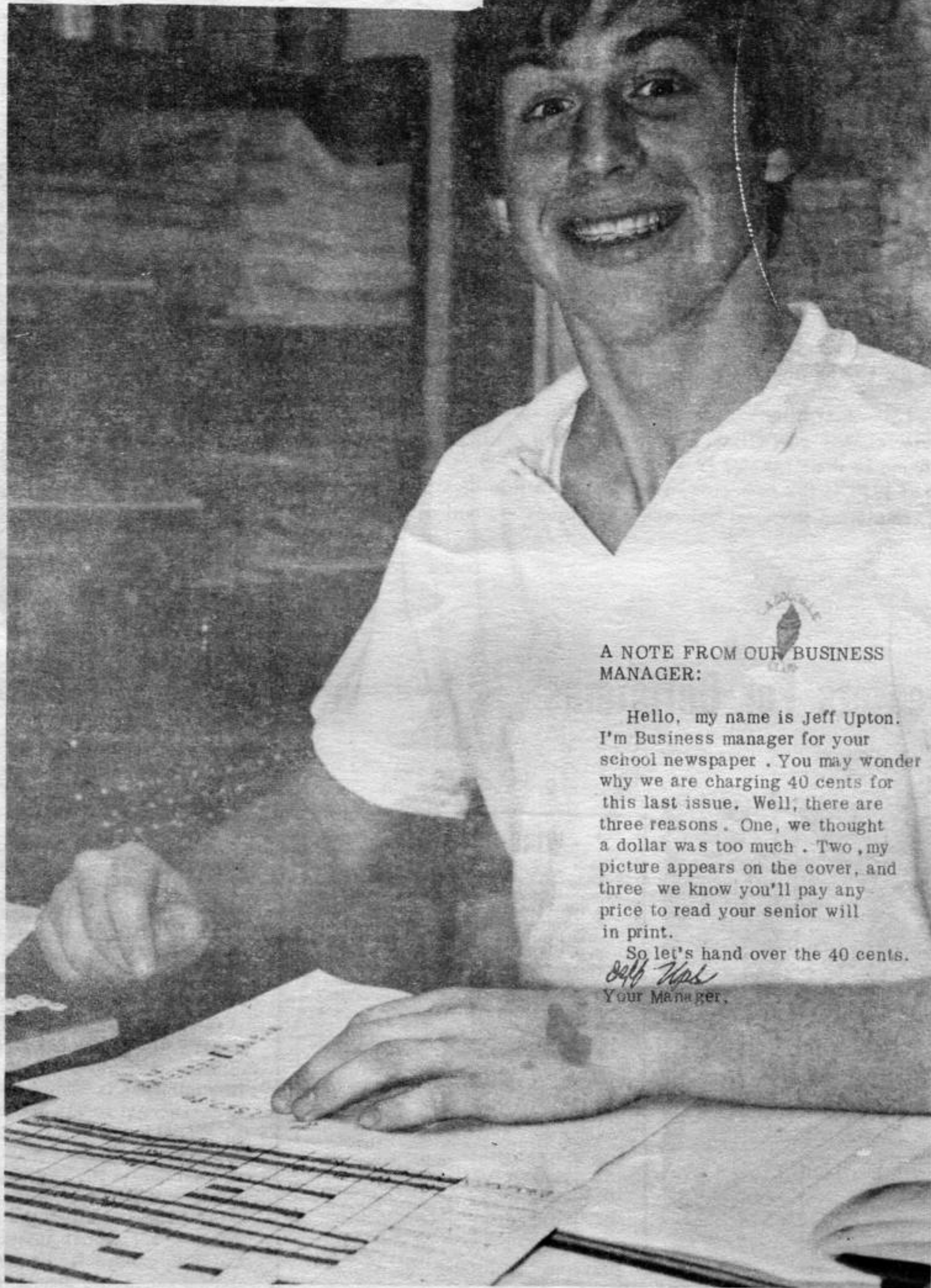

assembly honors top students

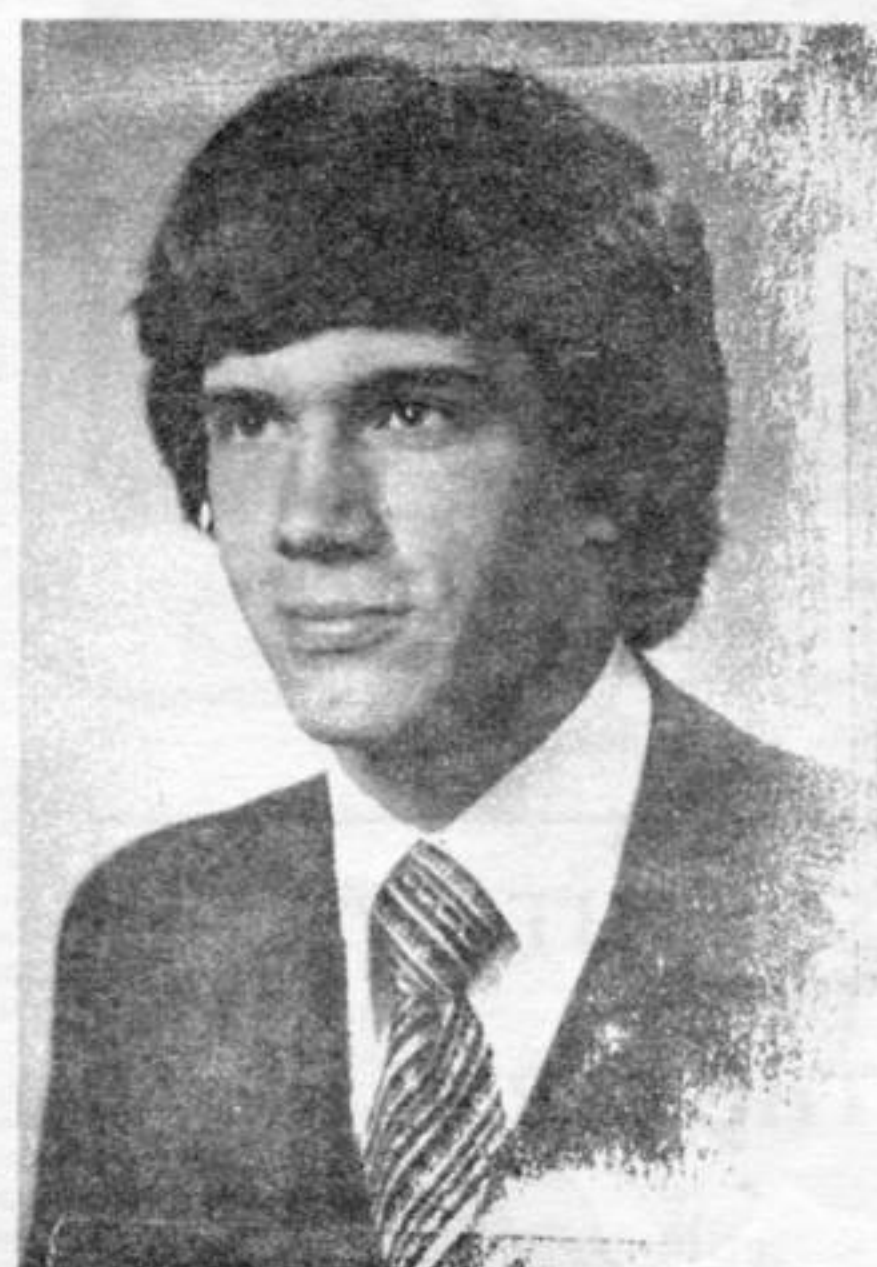

Approximately 150 students were honored at the annual Honors assembly held last Thursday evening in the auditorium.

Included were 41 honor graduates, students with a 3.5 accumulative grade point average or above. Academic Letters were awarded, for the first time, to 14 seniors who had taken six classes and had maintained a 3.8 grade point average for the first semester this year and for the first nine weeks of second semester.

Athletic Awards

In addition, three major athletic awards were also announced. The first was the John Karsten Award, the oldest and most prestigious award given by SJHS. It was received by Don Fedor for his outstanding scholas-

tic achievement, athletic ability, and character.

Michelle Priefer was this year's recipient of the Ted and Rae Stone Award. The award is given to the outstanding senior girl athlete and is also based on scholarship and character. This award also carries a \$300 scholarship to the college of her choice.

The Kip Reed Award was presented to Jerry Jones for his outstanding athletic ability, scholastic achievement, and character.

The Home Economics Department presented Cathy Barnett with the Fostoria Pickard Award for her outstanding achievement in this area.

The National French Exam winners were Bill Hammond, Beck Konieczny, and Lee Anne Ross. And

the Quiz bowl team was honored for their excellent performance this past year.

In addition, the Wind-Up staff members, and 14 Mazenblue staff members received the Quill and Scroll award for journalism.

The Bausch and Lomb science award went to both Liz Skelley and Mary Hageman. Other science awards were presented to Junior Jane Boerma for comparative anatomy and Freshmen Karen Kasischke for earth-science.

Glenn Huffman received the Art Award scholarship and Sandy Jiral received the Lake Michigan Art Scholarship.

Cheryl Aviles was this year's recipient of the Business Education Award.

The D. A.R. American History Award was presented to Junior Katie Sparks.

Approximately 100 students received other scholarships, National and State Merit Awards and Awards of Excellence.

Over one hundred students received the State of Michigan Michigan Competition Scholarship award for outstanding academic achievement.

John Taglia, Mark Rogers, and Jeff Costello received certificates of merit from National Merit Scholarships program, ranking in the top 2% of the nation.

Meg Armbruster, Richard Conto, Tom Morrow, and Joe Houseal were also honored by National Merit for ranking in the top 5% of the nation.

The University of Michigan Regents Alumni Club presented honorary awards for outstanding achievement to Meg Armbruster, Fred Boehm, Richard Conto, Shari Kiesel, Tom Morrow and John Taglia.

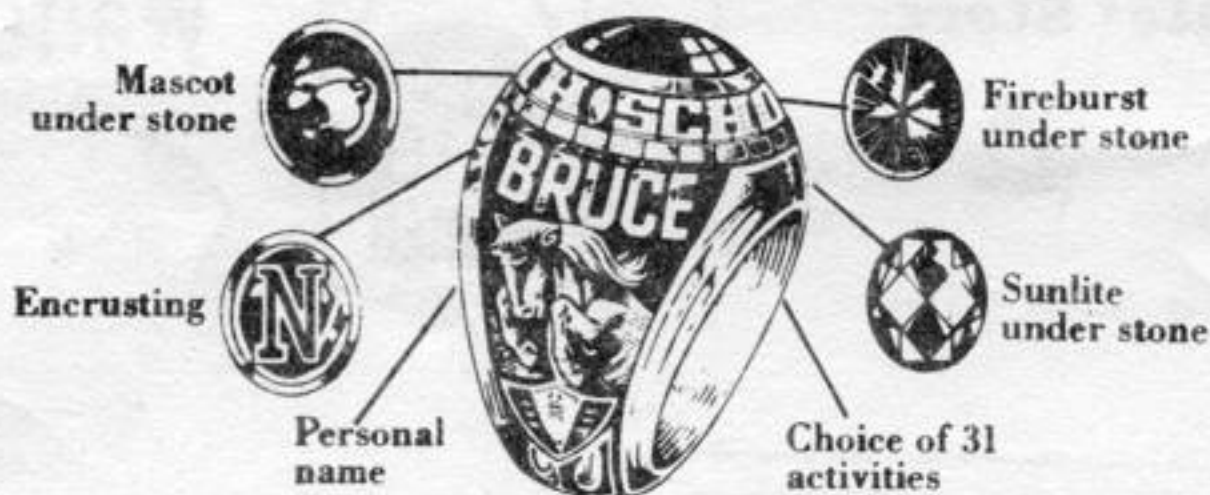

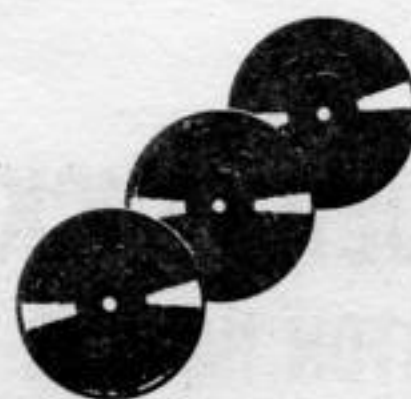

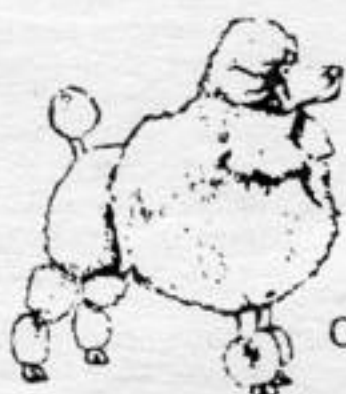
